The Anniversary has been well publicised around the Liverpool Archdiocese with Masses celebrated at so many churches. Further afield, Masses were said at St. Mary's, Hornchurch, St. Werburgh's, Chester, Our Lady Star of the Sea, Broadstairs and Sacred Heart, Edinburgh, (a Jesuit parish). Prayers were offered here at the Metropolitan Cathedral, SFX and other parishes, also at Ministeracres, Northumberland-the Headquarters of the Passionist Order.


